





Maryknoll Convent School (Secondary Section) School Development Plan (24/25-26/27)



Diversity, Freedom and Unity: There are thousands of varieties of daffodils, each with different names, yet they all belong to the same family. Many grow from the same bulb, but each flower blossoms in its unique way. At MCS, we nurture hundreds of students every year, each with their unique gifts. Every student is given the freedom and space to grow as an individual, nurtured to become the best she can be. 
