2.	<p>Beijing Exchange Programme 2021-2022 (F.2 – 5 level)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - The Programme would comprise the Hong Kong Session and the Beijing Session. - The Hong Kong Session was planned to be held in the beginning of February 2022. Students of Maryknoll Convent School (MCS), La Salle College (LSC) and Heep Yunn School (HYS) would provide home-stay for around 12 RDFZ students who would attend lessons in the 3 schools and visit cultural sites, museums and local attractions in Hong Kong. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - To provide an authentic language environment for learning Putonghua. - To let students experience the differences between Hong Kong and Beijing - To understand the history and development of Beijing - To use iPads for on-site exchange projects - To use photography equipment to record activities 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Due to the outbreak of COVID-19, this on-site exchange activity was cancelled. - A 10-day online exchange program was organized in April. Students were divided into groups and each group had to do research and prepare a presentation on different topics related to their 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - The exchange programme would continue to be held on-line until the end of the pandemic. - The new interactive television was bought after the on-line virtual exchange programme. It will be used for future on-line meetings with our partner school and other virtual exchange activities.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - The Beijing Session was planned to be held in mid-April 2022. Around 20 students from MCS, LSC and HYS would be led by 3 teachers of the 3 schools to visit RDFZ. They would stay in the dormitory of RDFZ on school days and with home-stay families during the weekend. Besides lesson observations, visits to cultural sites, museums, local attractions in Beijing and a project-based learning activity by using iPads would be conducted. - The new interactive television and related accessories would be utilized to facilitate the on-line meetings before and after the trips. 		<p>daily lives within these 10 days. They would stay in a hotel near QBHS in December. MCS teachers would have lesson observations and have some sharing with QBHS teachers. Visits to cultural sites, museums and local attractions near QBHS would be conducted. - The new interactive television and related accessories would be utilized to facilitate the on-line meetings before and after the trips. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - To share experience on teaching - To widen teachers' horizons, deepen their understanding of the educational, economic, social and cultural developments in the Mainland, with a view to enhancing their professional competence - To use the new video-conferencing equipment such as notebook computers to produce clips about the exchange programme 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Due to the outbreak of COVID-19, this on-site exchange activity was cancelled. - The notebook computers and related equipment were used to facilitate the on-line meetings. - The on-line virtual exchange activity was cancelled due to the suspension of school in Shanghai in the second term. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - If the COVID-19 pandemic continues, on-site exchange activities may be cancelled due to the quarantine orders in different cities.
